


Chunlin (Charlie) Pan, HVAC Building & **Control Engineer**

replace the Adobe Fillable Form which can be daunting to fill out from scratch. A new Fiscal Services attach your completed Excel worksheet and scanned receipts. This gives AP staff visibility to where your submission is in the approval process and the ability for them to send out timely reminders.

Fine Arts Building HVAC Recommissioning and Repairs

A proposal for replacing the unit in Room 301 will be approved on the October Board agenda.

Baseball Field Safety Upgrades

The District has received safety concerns regarding errant baseballs potentially impacting students, faculty, and staff at Grant Grover, which is located adjacent to the baseball stadium's outfield. In response to these concerns, we are developing a mutually agreeable solution through a project that involves drafting an agreement between the District and MCOF

Signage and Wayfinding (Districtwide)

This project will improve navigation for students, staff, and visitors, creating a more intuitive and accessible campus experience. The development of a Request for Proposal for consultants is underway.

IVC Campus Building 12 - New Student Center

The potential for a new student center at the Indian Valley Campus represents an exciting opportunity to enhance student engagement and support services. A proposal for design services is under review and expected to go to the Board for approval in November.

Capital Projects

Center for Student Success

We are in the final stages of construction and interior finishing. Final grading and the installation of hardscape and landscaping are currently in progress, and finishing touches are being added to the exterior. Waterproofing and spray testing for all skylights and terrace areas have successfully passed, ensuring long -term protection against water intrusion. The installation of the wood slat ceiling on Levels 2 and 3 is progressing steadily. The shelves for the library collection have been installed and are awaiting books. The installation and testing of the Mechanical, Electrical, and Plumbing (MEP) systems are ongoing. Furniture for the building will begin arriving and being installed in a few weeks.

The complex coordination of programs, faculty, and staff moving into the building is ongoing. Meetings cover departmental needs, move schedules, logistics, and support during the transition. After five years of programming, planning, and

construction, we are nearing the finish line. Thank you for your continued support and coordination as we move into our new space!

PE Complex Renovations

The project includes replacing noncompliant bleachers, removing, repairing, and replacing the existing pool deck and plaster, and making other necessary ADA updates. Installation of underground utilities around the pool area is currently underway.

During demolition, several unexpected conditions were uncovered. The construction and design teams work on solutions to ensure continued progress and long-term durability. Thanks to proactive coordination and swift decision making, the project remains on track despite these unforeseen challenges.
